WHAT IS THE CIBC NETWORK?

The CIBC Network values the critical role that early care and education programs and providers play in the healthy growth and development of all children ages birth to five years.

Its purpose is to build the capacity of programs and providers to meet the needs of all young children in order for them to develop and learn together.

WHAT ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE?

CIBC Network assistance may include resources, onsite consultation, or referrals based on the need of the site or of the provider.

WHO ARE THE CIBC NETWORK CONSULTANTS?

Consultants have experience working with children with special needs, identified disabilities, and/or challenging behaviors. They have knowledge of relationship-based and family-centered practices and knowledge of your community resources.

Consultants are skilled in problem-solving issues around inclusion and challenging behaviors.

Most consultants have a master's degree and/or certificates or credentials in early childhood special education, early childhood education, or child development.

WHAT DOES CONSULTING LOOK LIKE FOR EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION TEACHERS AND PROVIDERS?

Community-based, experienced inclusion and behavior consultants assist providers to cultivate the skills and tools needed to be successful as they support the development and early learning of all children.

- Meet with staff
- Observe environments
- Facilitate the development of action plans
- Support site implementation of those plans
